Partnership in Learning

I have been involved in education a long time and view our wonderful parents as an essential partnership in the learning journey of our most precious item, our children. Over the years I have learnt, and research suggests, that there are some essential things that we can do to ensure our children have the most success they can. These include,

- At least eight hours sleep per night and a regular bed routine such as going to bed at 6.30-7.00pm and reading a story before bed.
- Nutritious meals made of bread, cereals, fruit and vegetables. It takes a lot of brain power when students are learning and these clever little minds need to be fed. If they are hungry, they cannot concentrate and this affects their learning and ability to store learnt information.
